Join us to share your views on the information we collect about research participants to monitor if our studies are including people from all backgrounds.

No research experience needed.



Personal characteristics provide **information about a person**, including things like age, gender, ethnicity, and education. Collecting this information in research studies can help us **understand who is taking part**, and **who is not**. Knowing this can help us make changes to our studies if needed, to ensure **wider access** to research.

At the moment, we collect a small amount of information about personal characteristics in research studies. This means it is hard to know if our research is including people from all backgrounds. To address this, the DISTINCT project aims to agree a standard set of questions that we can ask study participants to collect personal characteristics with the goal of making our research more inclusive in future.



We are organising discussion groups with members of the public to talk about the question set, to make sure we are asking the right questions, in the right way.

We will be running four groups, each focusing on different topics:

- 1. Ethnicity, language, and religion
- 2. Health, disability, and unpaid care
- 3. Sexual orientation and gender identity
- 4. Education and employment

The discussion groups will have around 8-10 people, including researchers. Virtual meetings will last 2 hours, and in-person meetings will last 3 hours. We will offer attendees a voucher that can be used online and/or in high street stores of your choice and reimbursements for any travel expenses.
